Mixtures



A mixture contains two or more substances that retain all their original properties and can be physically separated. Mixtures can be homogenous or heterogeneous.



Key vocabulary

mixture

A physical combination of two or more substances.

substance

Something that has weight and takes up space; matter.

Hard and firm; not a liquid or a gas.

liquid

A wet substance that you can pour.

gas

A substance, such as air, that will spread to fill any space that contains it.

solution

A homogenous mixture in which substances are blended evenly. Or, the answer to a problem, an explanation.

dissolve

To seem to disappear when mixed with liquid.

property

A special quality or characteristic of something.
